

At First Baptist Church, Lauderdale (Memphis) which he joined in August 1964, he gave service as Church Clerk, member of the Board of Directors, and Dorcas Circle of the Missionary Society. His energies were given to other facets of the Church's activities. As a gourmet extraordinaire, he was always willing to be the "chef" in preparing menus for the Scholarship Committee's recognition dinner for graduates, and other areas where his expertise was needed.

Life meant a great deal to him, and his life meant so much to others, as in the affairs of young people who could count on him for encouragement as well as financial support. Aside from this, he was a friend to the elderly, who were the beneficiaries of his attention and any assistance he found necessary.

He loved life and lived it to the fullest, but he could not have done this so well without a strong faith in God, where he never put a question mark, and from which he never wavered. He found fulfillment in being a friend and was a loyal alumnus and supporter of Virginia Union University and other educational institutions providing a means for educational enrichment.



# A Testament To the Life Walter M. Simmons

"Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might:"

We celebrate the Homegoing of Walter M. Simmons, not by lamentations or regret, but with thanksgiving and appreciation to God for allowing him to inhabit this earth, influencing for good and touching countless lives, for many years.

Ceasing to physically dwell among us as of Monday, June 11, 2001, he has entered upon the heritage of a diviner and larger life, but his spirit remains in our midst.

He was born July 19, 1921 in Thomasville, Georgia, the youngest of fifteen children parented by Mardena (Jason) Simmons and Lola Larkin Simmons. Very early in life he accepted Christ as his Savior and joined First Baptist Church in Thomasville where he served throughout his residence there.

Beyond elementary and high school, he matriculated at Virginia Union University (Richmond, Virginia) from which he received the Bachelor of Arts Degree, and the Master of Arts Degree from Atlanta University (Atlanta, Georgia.) He continued studies at Harvard University, North Texas University, University of California at San Diego, and the University of Pennsylvania.

He served as a teacher in South Georgia, and for fourteen years as principal of Nashville (Georgia) Elementary and High Schools. Later he moved to Memphis, and for twenty years held positions as teacher/administrator for Memphis City School from which he retired in 1984.
